Some Safety Reminders – Archery deer hunting season has begun. For the next 2 months, be aware of deer darting across the road, not only just before sunset, but at other times of the day, like 10am or 2pm, when you're not expecting to see them. They will be on the move because of hunters in the woods.

Falling leaves are colorful this time of year, but are treacherous and often wet when lying on the roadway, so be aware of your road surface and what you are riding on and over.

Cold morning temperatures & fog produce a wet and sometimes slick road surface, so take extra precaution when traveling in the early mornings and especially riding on asphalt.

Get your **cold weather clothes** ready so you don't have to cut the riding season short. Remember, silk underwear is insulating, electric vests and gloves keep the core of your body warm, leather chaps or nylon after-ski pants can be peeled off after the day warms up. Stick plastic baggies on your toes [ladies] to keep your feet warm. And, don't forget, if the temperature drops, your rain gear will keep you warm even when it's not raining. If you don't have the right cold-weather riding gear, give a hint to your significant other to add your wanted items to your Christmas Wish List. Remember, wearing light or

reflective clothing helps you to be seen on these dark and dreary days.
