## **Rider Education**

Happy New Year Chapter P!

**Prepare to Ride.** Preparation, knowledge and responsibility are the keys to meeting motorcycling's challenge and minimizing risk. Ensuring that your motorcycle is mechanically ready is a part of preparation. Selecting the right protective gear to wear is also part of preparation. But don't overlook *yourself*. Your physical and mental preparations are as important as correct tire

pressure and protective gear. And you aren't completely prepared to ride until you've been properly licensed by your State motor-vehicle agency.

Understand Your Abilities. To ride safely, you must know the limits of your abilities – what you can do, what you know. You must also know the capabilities of your motorcycle – how it performs in a curve, how quickly it can stop. You must understand the environment in which you are riding – such as the road surface, visibility, traffic laws and the flow of traffic.

Cold Weather Riding. Riding at a temperature 32 degrees or below should be done only after a few days with no precipitation or hesitation. Ice lingers longer in shady areas. Sources of liquid on the road could be from a car wash, any sort of spills, melted snow running across the road where it freezes up at night, people dumping liquid from their cars at stop signs or intersections, bridges and declining corners. Be particularly careful when riding past open fences or tree lines as icy breezes can freeze the road and can catch you off-guard. Look further ahead rather than relying on evasive maneuvers. Try riding on high-traffic roads, as opposed to the back roads and slow down to increase your action time due to various weather conditions. If you start to become cold, pull over and warm-up. When you find an icy area, coast across in a straight line with the clutch disengaged and do not touch the brakes. [As discussed on the *GWRRA Message Board*]

As a reminder...Biker Dan will be giving a talk at the January Gathering. He is free to answer any questions and review your motorcycle insurance policy.

Also, don't forget to sign-up for the CPR/First Aid Class scheduled for April 9, 2005, at St. Benedict the Abbott Church in Peters Township and the ERC Class that will be held in May, 2005.

## The Garage

### Stuff to do over the winter

- Do not run the engine over the winter! You'll just create condensation in the engine and combustion byproducts (acids, etc.) in the oil. Resist the temptation.
- Winter is an excellent time to do other routine maintenance -- you'll miss riding and it's a good way to spend quality time with your bike(s) as you pine away for next season. Plus, you've probably been dragging your feet about performing some of the scheduled maintenance, haven't you? That's OK; we all have. Now's the perfect the time to get it out of the way.
- Read through your owner's manual, and perform any service that gets done once a year or more frequently, even if it isn't *quite* time yet. At the very least:
  - lubricate control levers and pedals and periodically operate all controls
  - lube driveshaft
  - check brake pads and rotors
  - change fluids (brake, clutch, etc.)
  - inspect/replace/clean air filter
  - check all bolts to make sure nothing is loosening
  - inspect tires (for cuts, uneven wear, dry-rot, tread depth, images of the Virgin Mary, etc.) remember to check valve stems and keepers
  - inspect swingarm and steering head bearings
  - lube suspension, pivot points, grease fittings, etc.
- Extra credit assignments:
  - Change fork oil

- Change coolant
  - Valve adjustment
  - Mount new tires (if it's time)
- A lot of this maintenance will seem intimidating to people who haven't done much work on their bikes. That's fine. Start with simple stuff and tackle the more involved tasks when you feel up to it. Or find friends who are more experienced with bike maintenance and bribe them to help you.
- If you didn't have stands to get the tires off the ground, make sure you check the tires every month or so to make sure they're at normal operating pressure. You may also wish to move the bike slightly every few weeks to prevent flat spots. (Or maybe this is another old wives' tale. "Your Mileage May Vary.")
- Clean up any rust spots with some very fine grit sand paper (until you get down to bare metal) and repaint the area with a matching color. Paint will not cure properly when it's really cold out, so if you aren't storing the bike somewhere warm, you might as well skip this step until the ambient temperature is over 65 degrees or so.
  - Color-matched paint may be available through your local dealership. Color-Rite seems to make much of the OEM paint for motorcycles.
- Order new spark plugs for your bike's return to use. (Optional, but usually inexpensive -- follow the maintenance schedule set by your bike's manufacturer.)
- Sign up for an early-season Motorcycle Safety Foundation Experienced Rider Course.

- Meet & Eats – 5 points
- Dinner Rides – 10 points
- Scheduled Rides – 10 points
- Over-Night Rides – 25 points
- Unscheduled Rides – 10 points
- Plaque Attacks – 25 points
- Chapter Gathering – 15 points
- Charity Events – 20 points
- Ride Captains – 5 points bonus

The basic rules are as follows:

The Chapter Director has the authority to change point values.

You must depart with the Chapter and arrive to the destination with the Chapter but you may leave the destination early.

Someone at each event will have a sign-up sheet and it is **YOUR** responsibility to record that you have attended the event. To get credit for the event, you **MUST** put your name on the sign-up sheet on the day of the event!

The winner of the Participation Points Program will receive his/her GWRRA annual dues paid for by the Chapter.
